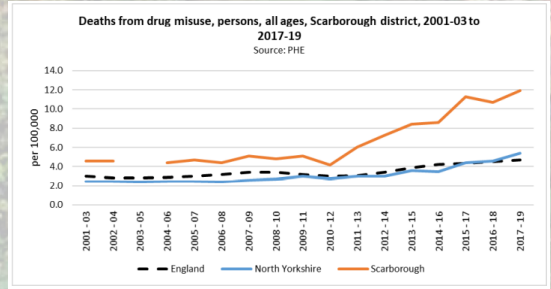
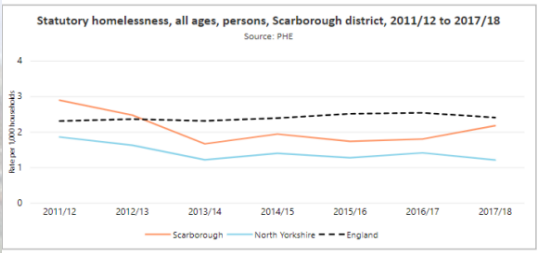


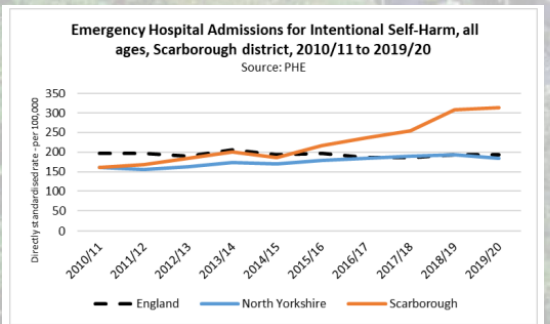
## Factors influencing homelessness in Scarborough

Scarborough has the second highest rate of homelessness among all districts in North Yorkshire



Deaths from drug misuse have decreased in Scarborough between 2016-18 and 2017-19, however the rate is significantly higher than England

Scarborough has a significantly higher rate of hospital admissions (314 per 100,000) than the England average (192.6 per 100,000). The proportion of hospital admissions for intentional self harm has increased between 2012/13 and 2019/20



2020, average weekly earnings is £422 significantly below England (£483)

## Learning from COVID

'Every one in' scheme launched to protect those most vulnerable during COVID.



- Funding provided to Local Authorities
- 62 people provided with temporary accommodation at any one time in Scarborough
- The overall additional expenditure associated with accommodation and related expenses during 2020/21 was in excess of £1million
- Increased outcomes for some people observed

Housing First principles:

- 1 Immediate access to housing with no housing readiness conditions
- 2 Consumer choice and self-determination
- 3 Recovery orientation
- 4 Individualized and person-driven supports
- 5 Social and community integration



- Headlines**
- 40 referrals received
  - 23 people getting intensive support
  - 7 people in accommodation

### Outcomes/next steps:

- People who are homeless or at risk of homelessness gain sustainable housing and social inclusion
- Fewer people will become homeless more than once
- People are supported to secure or maintain stable accommodation
- Develop a purpose built Extra Care + housing model to provide dedicated housing for rough sleeping/homelessness in Scarborough

## REACH is launched

August 2021 REACH was launched. A partnership approach between North Yorkshire County Council, Scarborough Borough Council, Tees Esk and Wear Valley Mental Health Trust, Beyond Housing and partners.

### REACH Consideration Criteria:

- 18+ (under 25's consider - Younger persons pathway)
- Homeless
- Multiple Disadvantage Index score >30
- Mental Health Needs
- Substance Misuse Needs
- Not engaging with service (including housing)
- Demonstrating a level of motivation to change
