





Roles


- Individual, community, local, regional, national place levels
- Coordinated, clear, strategic approach at all levels – holistic - systems
- Networks of expertise for collaboration
- Ensure common language and terminology
- Roles to support provision of good homes
- Access to safe and secure housing
- Grant funding
- Ensuring access to green and blue spaces around homes
- Access to transport infrastructure links
- Ensuring suitable design inside and outside of homes
- Reducing areas of deprivation and inequality
- Upholding the standards/regulations
- Raising awareness health improvement
- Making every contact count (MECC)
- Prioritising homes as a wider determinant of health

Challenges and barriers



- Existing housing stock
- Design
- Finance, funding costs
- Silo working
- Urban/rural/coastal needs
- Poverty and deprivation
- Policy and strategy not holistic/fit for purpose
- Differing home ownership, renting, transient tenures and homelessness needs
- Not enough supported guidance/legislation
- Communication/messaging gap for communities
- Economic climate and rising energy costs
- Limited trusted skilled trades
- Housing supply and demand

- Lacking retrofit, adaptation and improvements plan
- Lack of homes links with transport and communities for healthier places
- Health in homes seen as 'additional' rather than integrated
- Complex geographies, lack of granular data
- Impact of Covid-19 and shift in strategy e.g. more time at home, homeworking, neighbourhoods
- Available time and resource












Reflections

- Coproduction and sharing: partners and colleagues across the system
- Evidence: not one size fits all, but it is important
- Search for opportunities and levers for change- this demands a good knowledge of the system, so needs involvement from colleagues and partners.
- Important that all parties see the benefits, not just us
- It's not about taking over the remits of others, but we need to create
 a common understanding of health equity and the health impacts of
 what we do.
- Health, inequalities and sustainability rather than just health, ask the question- how will this reduce health (or any) inequalities and increase sustainability?
- Where does the power lie- do we have the authority or just the expertise? Influence and power jointly across the system
- Long-term thinking and vision- generation






Next steps
