Who is it for?

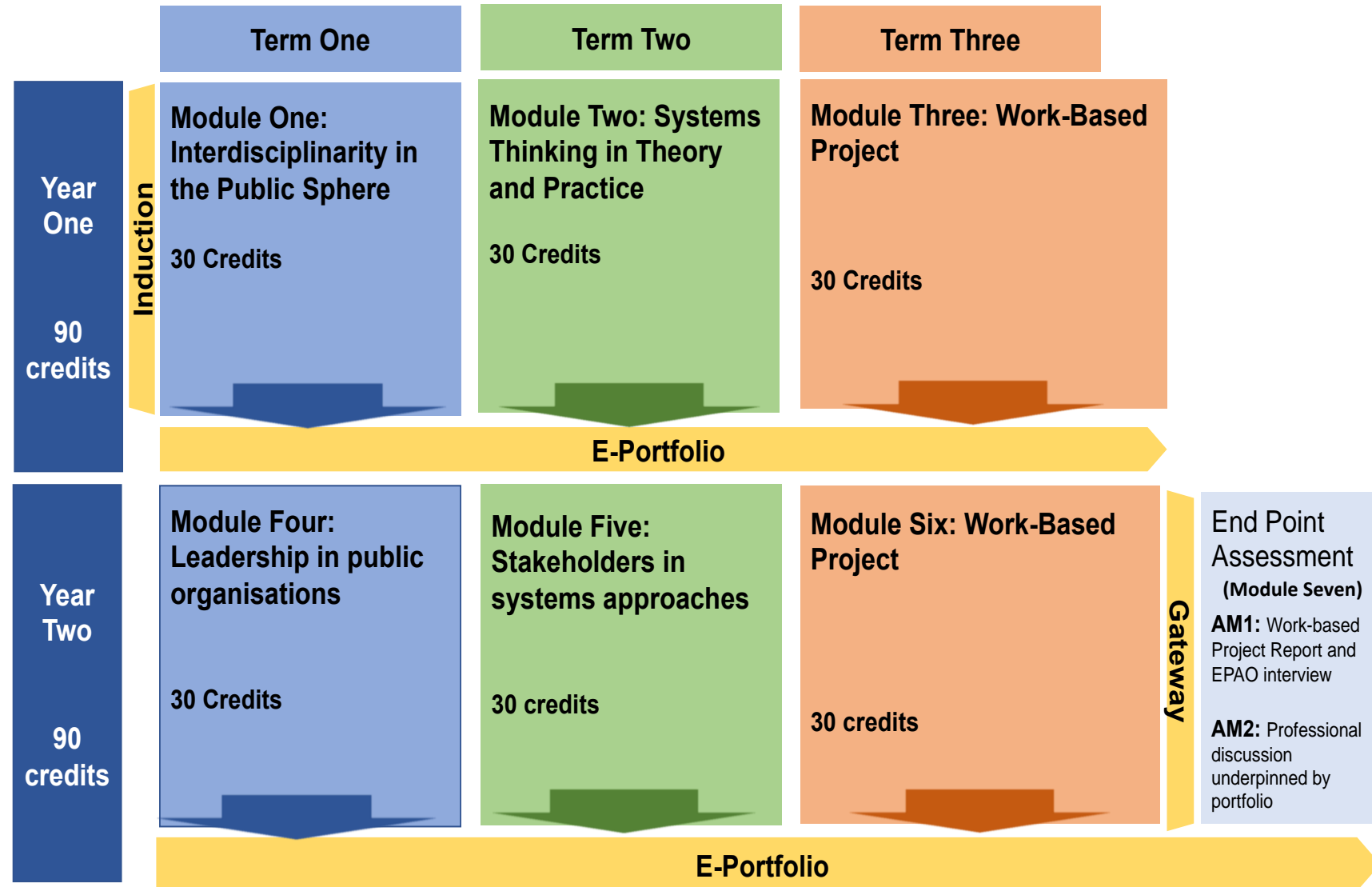
The Systems Thinking Apprenticeship will enrich the skills and knowledge of:

- People working in the public interest, who face complex and cross-disciplinary challenges;
- Employees who hold leadership positions and are keen on enhancing their professional development;
- People facilitating and co-designing programmes and services with a variety of stakeholders.
- Employees who deal with strategy, project management, human resources, service design and evaluation, organisational change, business architecture and cross-boundary work;
- After completion, students achieve a Systems Thinking Practitioner Level 7 Apprenticeship Certificate and an MSc in Systems Thinking in the Public Sector



Programme Details

- 4 taught modules and 3 work-based project modules
- 12 Face to face masterclasses; 3 per taught module (1 per month)
- Weekly asynchronous
 - Workshops/classes
 - Guided self study
- Formative and Summative Assessment
- 6 month End Point Assessment



Entry Requirements

- Cohort 2 January 2023 (applications open September 2022)
- Entry requirements: Either a first degree in any subject and/or a minimum of three years' work experience. Level 2 Maths and English will need to be evidenced prior to end-point assessment (EPA).
- £18,000 (fundable through the levy)
