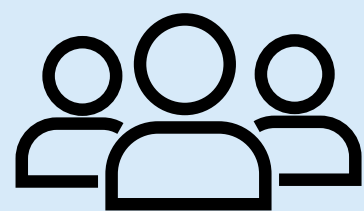


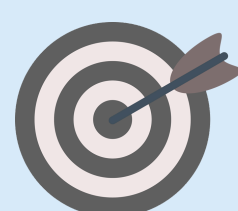
Yorkshire and Humber Healthy Child Programme Mapping

Who was involved

- OHID

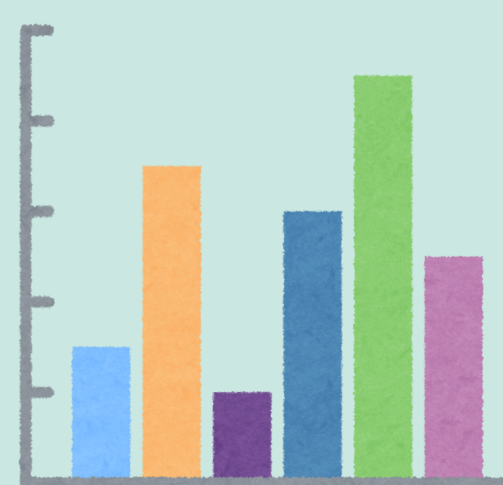
Aim



- To understand regional delivery models of the HCP.
- To support commissioners and providers to design their local offer.

What we found

- All 15 local authorities completed the mapping questionnaire, providing a comprehensive breakdown of local HCP delivery models.
- When analysed together, clear patterns of provision emerged with common methods employed across the region to achieve the objectives and outcomes as set out in the HCP guidance.



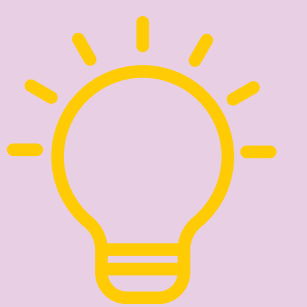
- There were some differences in the HCP models, and this was explored further within the HCP Peers Group and outside of the Peers Group, with relevant regional colleagues.

Key findings



- There is comprehensive coverage across all local authorities for:
 - Health visiting 5 mandated contacts
 - NCMP
 - Home safety and accident prevention
 - Infant feeding
- The least comprehensively delivered components included in the HCP are:
 - Vision, hearing
 - Weight management services (although these components may still be commissioned and delivered within the local system).

Impact of the work



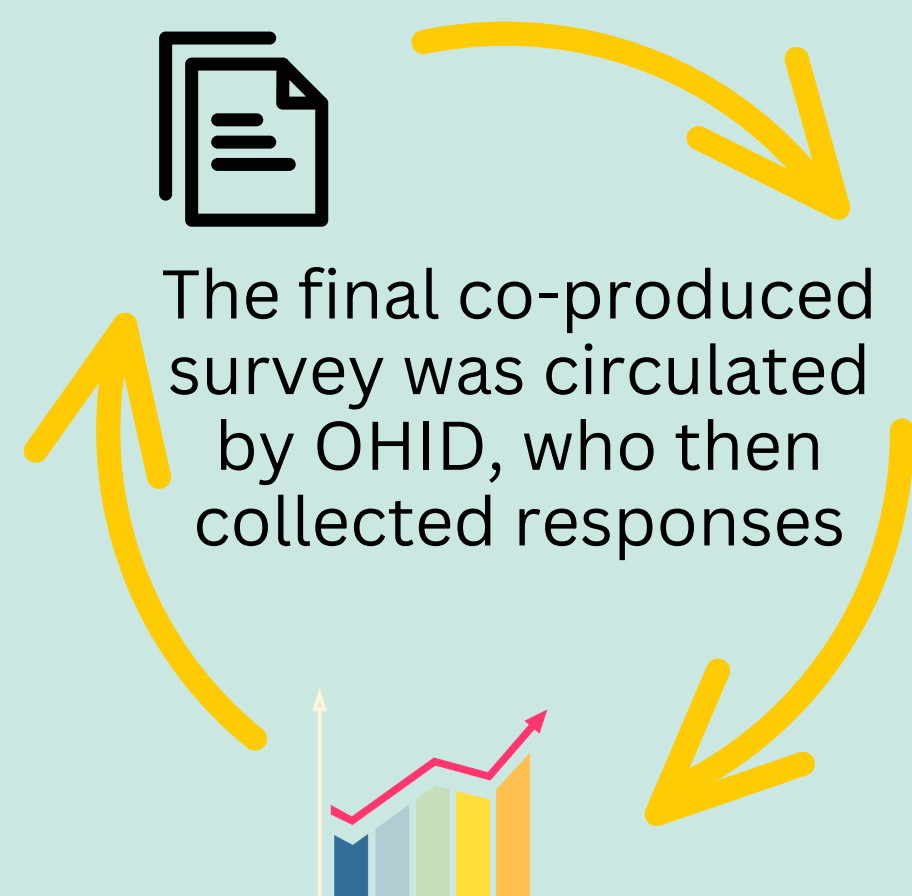
- **Developed, enhanced, and reinforced partnership working across the region.**
- **Facilitated further focussed sessions on elements of the HCP as part of the HCP Peers Group.**
- **For authorities approaching recommissioning of the HCP, it has provided a reference point to support the re-procurement process, especially the development of a service specification.**
- **Provided commissioners and Providers the opportunity to consider their service offer in relation to other areas across Y&H.**
- **Commitment to continue to work across the region on the HCP, to ensure we improve the HCP and outcomes for children, young people, and their families.**



What was done



- HCP Peer Group collaboratively agreed to undertake a regional mapping exercise on HCP.
- Colleagues from Kirklees Public Health and OHID created a draft questionnaire to capture the local HCP delivery models.
- The draft was shared with the HCP Peers Group for comments.



- The final co-produced survey was circulated by OHID, who then collected responses
- Kirklees Public Health and OHID reconvened once the survey had closed to review and undertake data analysis.
- Two reports were produced: 1. For the commissioners of the HCP. 2. For the Providers of the HCP.
- The key findings from the mapping exercise were presented to ADPH.

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
