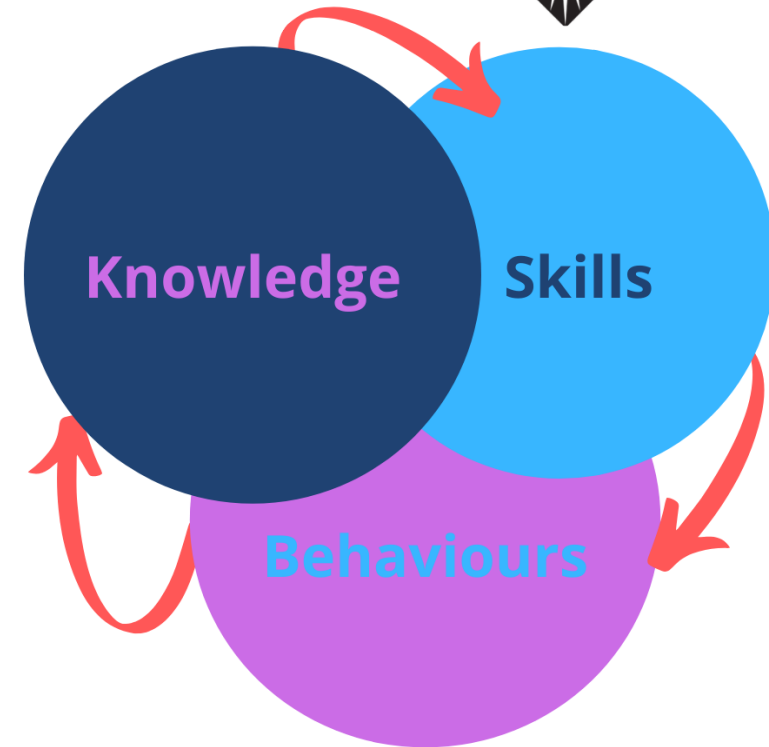

- Starts September 2021.

Delivery approach

Blended learning

- Face-to-face classroom delivery.
- Online learning including live interactive sessions.
- Independent learning.
- Group work.
- Collaborative learning.

Delivery model

- 1 day per week 'off the job' learning which includes:
 - 1 day face-to-face/online delivery every fortnight.
 - 1 day directed study every fortnight.
- Dedicated Public Health team support throughout.
- Tripartite meetings (apprentice /employer /academic) - every 10 weeks

Entry requirements

- ✓ Level 2 English and maths (grade C or above).
- ✓ 112 UCAS points
Or
